

News from the executive committee

A 3-year trial period on Baby IFYE subsidy for attendance on their first IFYE conference has come to an end. For the AGM in July 2011 the Executive Committee recommend that the Baby IFYE conference fee subsidy continue in its current format.



The proposal detailed below was adopted at the AGM in Norway in 2007, and ran for a 3-year trial period. From 2011 - 2016 (a 5-year period), 800CHF will be available each year to encourage IFYE's to attend their 1st conference. Each newcomer will receive a maximum contribution of 160CHF towards the published conference fee. It will be subject to the following conditions:

- (1) Full time attendance at the conference
- (2) Valid in any of the first 3 years following their exchange trip (an IFYE in 2008 could receive the contribution in 2009, 2010 or 2011).
- (3) The contribution is not valid in the IFYE's own country.
- (4) The application form will be issued and submitted to the Treasurer during the conference attended, and payment made that week.'
- (5) The contribution will be reduced proportionately if more than 5 applications are received in any one year.'

Good things in small packages, Ulster YFA

They say 'good things come in small packages' and that's certainly true of Ulster YFA (Young Farmers Ambassadors) Northern Ireland's IFYE organisation. We might be small in numbers but we have the advantage of living close together which makes it easier for our members to attend events regularly. Each winter the committee organises a dinner, usually on a theme and over the last few years we've had murder mysteries, mock weddings and even the reading of a will.

In summer there is a family picnic which is held in a different beauty spot each year. We've visited beaches, forest parks and even Rathlin Island off the north coast, and this is usually an opportunity for members to meet incoming exchangees.

Throughout the rest of the year we try to arrange activities which will cater for all ages and interests and these can vary from treasure hunts and sporting competitions to barn dances and quizzes.

Once every four years we host the UK reunion and our next one is scheduled for October 2012 in the historic city of Londonderry/ Derry. Although Derry suffered a lot during the Troubles and the economic depression of the 1970s and 80s, in recent years it has undergone a metamorphosis and has recently been named UK City of Culture 2013. The city also hosts the biggest Hallowe'en party in Ireland so there should be plenty going on that weekend for those who want to ioin us. In preparation for this we have been running regional fundraisers. The first three centred





round food with a Chinese banquet, a Quiz and Irish Stew night and a 'Plant a Pot' Curry Night. The latter was hosted at Trevor Woods' new pottery studio where we not only capitalised on Claire Woods' horticultural expertise but explored our own artistic talents in clay. Our next big event is a 'Not So Young' Farmers Night, to increase the profile of the organisation and allow past members to catch up with each other and relive their youth.



The funds raised will also help us to support and promote the IFYE programme through the Young Farmers' Clubs of Ulster. In recent years the number of applications has been dropping, mainly due to the unpredictable economic situation, and so YFA members have been working even harder to spread the IFYE gospel. We have been talking to young people and their parents about the benefits of exchange and how this type of travel experience is like no other. Our efforts may be on a small scale but just as a journey of a thousand miles starts with a single step we hope that, along with the work of other members around the world, it will contribute to

ensuring that the IFYE exchange programme continues to benefit rural young people for many years to come.





SILVER PIN REPORT

Recognition of an IFYE member's 25th anniversary

At the 2010 Annual General Meeting (AGM) held on Thursday 05 August in Ursprung, Austria, the executive committee was requested to consider and report back to the 2011 AGM, regarding the tradition of presenting a silver pin to 25th anniversary members.

Background:

The presentation of a silver pin to mark the 25th year since a members exchange trip commenced in 1983 at the 25th conference in The Netherlands. The raffle, which is still held, commenced a couple of years earlier, initially to raise funds for champagne to celebrate the 25th conference. It proved to be such a successful fund raiser that the surplus money was used to purchase silver pins to present to the 25th anniversary members who attended that conference, a tradition that has continued.

The 2010/11 budget, presented to the members at the 2010 AGM, included an allocation of 3,600 CHF (2,400CHF was to be taken from the lifetime member fund) to purchase 20 tie pins (given to males) and 40 pendants (given to females). The members queried the perceived high cost of the silver pins and a motion proposed by the Swedish IFYE members requested the executive committee prepare a report on the matter and present it to the members at the 2011 AGM

Newsletter Questionnaire:

The IFYE newsletter included a feature on the silver pins: members: were requested to complete a questionnaire or send their suggestions concerning the issue to their contact member -37 responses were received from 5 countries.

Cost of silver pins:

The executive committee sought quotations for the supply of silver pins. It was concluded that there is very little difference between the existing suppliers quote (38€ for a tie-pin and 19€ for a pendant) and that which can be sourced elsewhere. The proposed supplier is yet to be confirmed.

Mid Term Meeting:

The Mid Term Meeting was held in Luxembourg from the 07 -09 January 2011. The executive committee considered the responses received from the members. In conclusion:

- (1) There is general support from the members for the continuation of the silver pin presentation;
- (2) The issue of a silver pin to Baby IFYE's required consideration and;
- (3) Eligibility to receive a pin (apart from it being 25-years since a members exchange trip) should be considered.

In addition, the questionnaire replies provided several addition suggestions of how to give recognition to anniversary members, including:

- A 25th year anniversary IFYE exchange report / a list of members names to be included in the newsletter;
- Anniversary members are invited to take part in the first dance at the farewell dinner IFYE and;
- Anniversary members receive a cake at the IFYE conference.

The above and the additional suggestions made by members would be an option for the conference hosts to consider for inclusion on an annual basis if so required.

Recommendation:

The under-noted recommendations to be proposed for adoption at the 2011 AGM:

- (1) The presentation of a silver pin to mark, the 25th year anniversary since a members exchange trip should be continued
- (2) A Baby IFYE is not eligible to receive a silver pin
- (3) Additional silver pins to be purchased from the best priced supplier
