Greetings from the Editor

It's soon Christmas again and here is our Christmas gift to all our members: A Christmas edition of the Newsletter. Hopefully you'll have some time to enjoy reading it during the holiday....even if it's not that long I hope the days of Christmas is less stressful than normal and will give you time to look back on the I year we are about to end, hopefully with lot of good memories.

In this Newsletter you can read about exchange to the US in 1961 and you can read more about next summer's conference in Kungälv. We have received news from around Europe; from Austria, YFA reunion in Wales and from the Norwegian mountains and there has been a reunion in the Netherlands for the IFYE's of 1966 to the US. A huge thank you to all the co writers in this edition!!

This summer as we shared great days in IFYEland, Norway suffered from a great tragedy with bombing of the government buildings in Oslo and the Massacre on the youth camp on Utøya island, killing 77 people and injuring more then 150 people, mostly teenagers. A lot have been said and more are to be told in the media about this tragedy. For us here in Norway it's constant headlines on the topic (and if there is no really news they make a headline out of something anyway). We are all affected in one way or another and as IFYE I'm very glad for the fantastic news that our member Kari Bjørke who works in the government buildings and was in her office at the time of the blast, was left with no injuries. She was fortunate that her office faced the back side of the building.

I want to share a poem from 1936 written by the Norwegian poet Nordahl Grieg. This poem was inspired by the civil war in Spain and later, in 1952 set to music. The song is widely known around Norway and after the tragedy it became the main uniting song used in memorial services and during the rose marches all over Norway. I find it particularly moving by knowing that some of the youth escaping by swimming from the island sung this song, to try to keep up motivation and focus and to avoid the sound of the shooting.

As an IFYE with our founding idea I find this text to be very strong and I just want to share it with you. If you haven't heard it sung you can find it in several versions on You tube.

To be an IFYE from Sweden to USA 1961

A phone call I never will forget. It was just before Christmas and I had been chosen to be an IFYE to USA for six months the summer of 1961. I had heard from several former IFYE's it is a great experience and a great opportunity to widen your horizons and learn more about the world. So I had big expectations. We were five IFYE's from Sweden and we meet for some days in early spring in Stockholm to learn about the IFYE life and to become grassroots ambassadors, visit the USA Embassy to show our x-rays of our lungs and get the Visa. Taking a lot of pictures to show in our families and 4Hclubs and other meetings.

By boat

May 13 we left by boat from Gothenburg with Swedish American Line M/S Kungsholm. It took 9 days and nights to cross the Ocean. Nov 19 we went back. Roundtrip coast SEK 1000. We were 11 IFYE's, two from Norway, four from Finland and five from Sweden. Among other things we practiced folk dances together. We had been told before to make a program together to show for other IFYE's during mid-point meeting. It was a very nice start to get to know the girls and boys from our neighbour countries. We arrived in New York May 22. The night before we stopped outside The Statue of Liberty with the Manhattan skyline in the background because we were too early to get to the quay. It was so impressive to see the skyline. That was our first meeting with the New World. We celebrated with champagne, the first champagne in my life.

Greyhound bus was our transportation all the time first to Washington DC. We had one introduction week at the National 4H centre together with the five from India and a boy from Portugal. We got all our bus tickets in a long row to keep and then we were on our way out to our different host states.

My first state was **Rhode Island** for two months with two host families with children a little younger than me, 4H meetings, Rotary meetings, County 4H-camp, State fair. To be a family member is something very special and gives you friends for life.

I went by bus for several days; new IFYE's entering the bus very often, to our **Midpoint meeting** for a week at Purdue University Indiana. It was for all IFYE's in the US at the time about 100 from 30 different countries. It was very much fun and lots of new friends and learning many new things. A little like our European IFYEmeetings.

My second host state was **Minnesota**, for four months and four nice host families, 4H-

county fairs, State fair, Weddings, meetings with many Swedish Americans.

We had **free time** tree weeks. We went by car to Colorado meeting my IFYE-sister Ingrid's relatives and then bus to Georgia visiting friends. And then meeting for a week at the National 4H Centre with the Scandinavian IFYE's and the group from the Netherlands to evaluate the stay. And all were so happy and satisfied with their new experiences; new friends and all agreed it had been a great stay. It had been one of our best and most memorable time in our lives.

1964 I attended my first European IFYE Conference in Norway followed by many more and the World Conferences in Sigtuna 2003 and Adelaide 2008. It is to experience and share IFYE-life again and meet your own big IFYE family again and again.

I still have good contact with two of my host families in Minnesota. I talked to one of my host sisters for two hours on the phone when it was 50 years since her wedding last August. It was good memories.

If you haven't been to a conference come to Kungälv, Sweden in July 2012.

My two daughters were inspired of me and went as IFYE's. Malin to Switzerland 1990 and Liselott to Australia 89-90. And now Liselott is married to the Australian dairy farmer Gary who she met then.

Christmas gift to all cake lovers

(recommended from the Scottish branch of Santa's Office)

Try out the Toffee Apple Cake

175g unsalted butter (softened)
175g light muscovado sugar
3 large eggs (beaten)
175g self raising flour (sifted)
1 teaspoon (4.76 grams) mixed spice powder
3 green apples (remove core and slice)
50g flaked almonds (optional)
1 tablespoon (14.3 grams) demerara sugar



20cm loose bottom cake tin, lined with greaseproof paper.

Oven temperature 180C, 160C (fan oven), 350F, Gas 4.

In a large bowl mix the butter and sugar together until they are light and fluffy. Gradually add the eggs to the bowl, until they are combined. Lightly fold in the self raising flour and the mixed spice to the bowl. Put half of the mixture into the tin, smooth the top and cover it with half of the apple slices, put the remaining mixture in the tin and lay the apple slices attractively on the top, then sprinkle the Demerara sugar and almonds (optional).



Cake testing completed (yummy $\ensuremath{\textcircled{}}$)

Bake in the middle shelf of the oven for 25 minutes until it is golden brown and firm to touch. Allow the cake to cool for 10 minutes before you remove it from the tin. Very nice served warm or cold. (Cake will keep for two days in an airtight container).
