My first European IFYE conference An IFYE newcomer's report

On Sunday afternoon, we met in Ljubljana at the train station. Since we were already a little late, our route led directly to Velden. After just under two hours of driving, we arrived at our final location, Cap Worth. The location is located right next to Lake Vrba and has a well-kept pier designed for relaxing in the water and sunbathing. We received a warm welcome from the organizers from Austria. We were assigned a room that we shared with four German participants. The latter were younger and we quickly caught up. After settling in, we went to dinner and started getting to know the others. The participants were of all ages from 18 to 88 years. Despite the age difference, the company was pleasant and the dinners were accompanied by laughter and good mood. After the tiring drive, we went to bed earlier that first evening so that we would be rested and full of energy for the next day.



We started Monday with an early breakfast, because later the bus for the first excursion was already waiting for us. First, we took a look at the maschinenring company, which started its entrepreneurial journey in the 1960s.

After the excursion, we had some free time, which we used to rest. Another meeting followed, which had the key word precisely with newcomers (new participants). The problem is that many countries cannot even find young people who would go on such an exchange. we talked mostly about how to encourage them, now the new participants will also get some financial support, which they hope will attract young people at least a little.

New day, time for a new trip. We started the day very early, as we went on a trip to Carinthia, Slovenia. We had some problems with road transportability, as they were still repairing the effects of the floods. At night, they were caught by another storm, which again caused inconvenience. Mežica mine. First, they gave us a brief history of the mine, and later we took a mini-train ride deep underground. The ride lasted 15 minutes in complete darkness and with loud rumbling. I really liked the tour of the mine, and I hope that others also enjoyed it and experienced a new crazy experience. At night, just like the previous day, night swimming followed, with Tadej's friend from Switzerland, who hosted him last year as IFYE.



New day, time for a new trip. We started the day very early, as we went on a trip to Carinthia, Slovenia. At night, they were caught by On Wednesday afternoon, all European countries had the opportunity to present them selves in whatever way they liked. Although we were not even aware of what was waiting for us, in the end the presentation went great. At our stand, we offered them some traditional Slovenian food and snacks and we are the only ones who can boast that our table was served exclusively from home Slovenian food and drink. The only exception was Gorenjka chocolate, which we bought in a store. At 5 p.m., our part of the dance followed. Rene used his excellent knowledge of folklore and taught us three dances in less than an hour. Everyone was more than obviously excited about the dance, because after the dance, everyone wanted to take a picture with us. I think we left a good impression among the participants, and that they will remember us for a long time.

After the European afternoon, we all got together in a bar, where we had fun long into the night. I remember the stories of older people the most, who told how they were in the 60s and 70s. years went on exchange. No phones, no knowledge of the language,...



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On Thursday afternoon, the general assembly of the European IFYE Alumni Association took place. As part of it, diplomas were awarded to silver and gold IFYE participants. I was surprised how many people were on the exchange 25 years ago, those are silver IFYEs. There were also a slightly smaller number of people who had taken part in the exchange before 50 years or even longer ago. The end of the assembly was marked by the awarding of prizes from the lottery ticket, which we both (Tadej and Rene) had sold the most tickets for, and that's why we were successfully awarded, as we received a very special gift from the first vice president, a bottle of real Irish whiskey.

Why did we go to this conference in the first place ?

Hmm, this is indeed a good question. As young farmers, we feel obliged to preserve our farms in the future, to improve them, to make work easier and, above all, to bring new hope, new light to the farm, which will give us the impetus for new ideas. And that's why right now, when our parents are still young enough to take care of the farm themselves, we can participate in international exchanges. In doing so, we gain new experience, new knowledge, competences, see good practices, make new acquaintances and possibly new business partners or even a life partner, who is a very important element in the success of the farm.

Tadej, as a former IFYE exchange participant, has already brought some good practice to his home farm, and he is also happy to pass on new knowledge and experience to his peers, relatives... so by participating in this conference, we wanted to bring this experience closer to someone else. , and encourage it for IFYE exchange. We also passed on our knowledge, our competences and especially our habits from our home farm to this year's exchange participants. Each exchange is also an unforgettable experience that you can never forget. And we can't wait and sincerely hope that we will be able to pass on our experiences and beautiful memories from exchanges to our children, grandchildren,...
