IFYE Slovenia - innovations in the IFYE programme

IFYE Slovenia officially established

To open the window into the world of new experiences, good practices, and personal growth! This is the mission of IFYE Slovenia. A mission that inspired us to establish our own IFYE association – IFYE Slovenia.

On Friday, 22nd November, representatives of 8 rural youth associations and the Slovenian Rural Youth Association (Zveza slovenske podeželske mladine, ZSPM) unanimously supported the establishment of IFYE Slovenia and elected Mateja Golc as the president for the 2025-2027 term. This means that after six years (the exchanges were coordinated by ZSPM since 2018), Slovenia now officially has its own association for organizing exchanges under IFYE Europe.

During the founding assembly, which was led by former ZSPM president Anja Kastelic, attendees reviewed the work plan for the upcoming year 2025, the association's statute, and listened to speeches by notable participants, including all three ZSPM presidents, which have supported IFYE exchanges since 2018. Although ten legal entities are among the founding members of the association, anyone who resonates with our values – honesty, open-mindedness, friendliness, solidarity, enthusiasm, and love for community – is welcome to join.



Our members include young men and women, farmers, students, and, above all, young volunteers from rural areas.

A special thanks goes to the hosts at the Pri Martinovih Tourist Farm (Turistična kmetija pri Martinovih), who had been a host family to many participants of the exchange, and to Julija Kordež, former IFYE Slovenija coordinator, for capturing the evening through her photography.

Key goals of IFYE Slovenia:

- 1. Connecting, collaborating, and engaging rural youth and those with a connection to rural areas. Through networking, we aim to educate and empower them for life in rural areas.
- 2. Facilitating youth exchanges to host farms abroad and within Slovenian borders, and help them with organization, financial help and mobility support.
- 3. Welcoming international rural youth to Slovenia, organizing their stays with host farms, and offering them mobility support.



An extended thanks goes to everyone who has in any way contributed to the association, among them; Rok Damijan and Anja Kastelic, former presidents of ZSPM, Polona Globočnik and Julija Kordež, former heads of international cooperation at ZSPM and Neža Špenko and Tjaša Stiplovšek, both IFYE Slovenia coordinators.

Furthermore, we're thrilled to announce that Slovenia will be hosting two exchanges in the year 2025. Namely, the first one will take place in June and July (3-5 weeks, arrival on June 23rd 2025) and the second in September and October (3-5 weeks, arrival on September 1st 2025).
