IFYE Conference Report 2025 - England

The IFYE European Conference kicked off in style at The Castle Head Study Centre in Grange over Sands, Cumbria, at the beginning of August with ninety-five participants from fifteen countries in attendance! All IFYE's were greeted with a lovely goody bag that included a thermal Travel Mug. This was followed by an amazing reunion with new and old friends, and the incredible IFYE Spirit was everywhere you looked. We had Lowick YFC run the Bar in the evenings.



On Sunday the fun began the welcome service in the Chapel including a talk from Leoni Purdy R.A.B.I (R.A.B.I is a charity supporting the farming community in England & Wales) and we had a collection for the charity that was followed by all the group photos. In the afternoon visits to Sizergh Castle, Holker Hall and Levens Hall were in available. All stunning historic houses and gardens, with beautiful weather too. The activity for the evening was the Team Challenge it was making red bunting which everyone really enjoyed and was then used to decorate the Sports Hall, which we used for social events.



On the Monday coach trips options were to a prize-winning Dairy Farm (Beckside Farm, Whicham) followed by a visit to the town of Ulverston, or a trip to the Lakes Aquarium and The World of Beatrix Potter and then a cruise on Windermere, starting from Bowness-on -Windemere. Alternatively, a few members stayed at Castle Head to do needle felting and made Herwick Sheep. The evening was spent attending country meetings and Bingo Night.

On Tuesday there were three more trip options. Firstly, to a Sheep Farm (Low Beckside Farm, Mungrisedale) and J36 Auction Mart at Kendal. This group were hosted by Hector Meanwell, the NFYFC Young Farmer of the Year 2024 and Low Beckside Farm was formerly Newton Rigg Agricultural College Sheep Farm, but on the closure of the agricultural college it was bought by the Ernest Cook Trust. In the afternoon, the members were hosted by North West Auctions (NWA) at J36 Auction Mart.

The second group visited two beautiful Lakeland villages of Coniston and Hawkshead. They also visited the Ruskin Museum in Coniston.



The final group spent the day walking and wild swimming in the Lake District and completed part of the long-distance path call ed the Cumbrian Way. The walking guides were Ben and Becky, from the local YFC.



Albie from Farmers Weekly attended the conference in the afternoon and evening, interviewing several IFYE members from various countries. A report about the activities of IFYE and YFA was subsequently published in the 15 August 2025 edition. In the evening it was time to put our dancing shoes and fancy-dress outfits on with the theme being Wear Something Red everyone had a wonderful time, there were many different outfits even including a Post-box. We danced to music by Liz Harrison, the organist from the Tower Ballroom at Blackpool.

On Wednesday it was Show-time. We were all guests of Cartmel Agricultural Society at the annual Cartmel Show. A traditional agricultural show, Cattle, Sheep, Horses, Dogs, Rabbits, Handicrafts, Cumberland and Westmorland Wrestling and vintage tractors. The main attraction was a Sheep Race, one of the sheep was called "IFYE." Everyone had a wonderful day exploring the showground at Cartmel Racecourse. After an enjoyable day at the show, it was back to Castle Head for Fish and Chips served at the Village Fryer van in the Car Park and that was followed by Home-made Ice Cream served by Wraysholme Tower Creamery from a converted cattle trailer.









In evening we had Country meetings and Estonia did their presentation inviting everyone to join them next summer for the 66th IFYE European Conference.

The final full day of the Conference it was time for the General Assembly and Tombola in the Chapel at Castle Head. In the afternoon everyone had free time and used the opportunity to either walk into Grange over Sands and explore the local area, do some packing, or have a quick nap. Before we knew it, it was time to head back into the Chapel for the Flag Ceremony with England team handing the IFYE flag over to Estonian members ahead of next year's Conference. Then time to get in our finest attire and head to the coaches to get to Olde Mill in Bardsea for a Pimm's reception in memory of Robin and Martin who are sadly no longer with us, followed by a delicious farewell dinner. Everyone danced, chatted, and had a blast until late in the evening.









It's always tough to say goodbye, but the excitement of seeing each other again makes it all worth it. One thing is for sure: it's not "goodbye" but "see you soon!"
