Viola went on exchange to Switzerland in 2024, please click on the picture below to view a video clip of the trip.







IFYE exchange trip to Taiwan

After a 30-hour journey, I arrived in hot and humid Taiwan for a two-month 4H exchange - my first visit to Asia. I had chosen Taiwan because I wanted to experience a culture and environment as different from Finland as possible.

The trip began with an orientation introducing us to Taiwanese agriculture, culture, and 4H activities, together with other IFYEs from around the world. We also visited Taipei, including the Ministry of Agriculture and the famous Taipei 101 skyscraper.









Food quickly became a memorable part of the experience. I encountered unusual local dishes like duck intestines, pig skin, and congealed blood - my only real culture shock - but soon learned to enjoy the country's diverse flavours, even trying bean and spring onion ice cream.

During my exchange, I lived with four host families across different regions: Miaoli, Hsinchu, Tainan, and Yilan. With each family, I explored local farming practices, from rice and melon fields to mushroom cultivation, joined community workshops for seniors, and experienced daily Taiwanese life. Weekends were filled with family activities like bike rides, visiting hot springs, and firefly watching.

Communication was sometimes challenging, as few people spoke English, so I relied on translators, gesture, and a few Mandarin phrases. Despite language barriers, people were warm, helpful, and endlessly generous - I even sent home several boxes of gifts and Taiwanese tea.









Throughout the exchange, I gained insight into Taiwan's agriculture, education, and everyday culture, while also reflecting on my own Finnish identity. Although locals sometimes mistook my calmness for boredom or irritation, their kindness always made me feel welcome.

At the end of the program, we received diplomas for participation, and I took one last walk through Taipei before heading home.

What did I take away from two months in Taiwan? Tangibly, many gifts - and a few extra kilos - but more importantly, lasting friendships, deeper cultural understanding, and a renewed appreciation for humanity's shared values. As the saying goes, travel broadens the mind - and I can confirm it truly does.
